JIMMIE ECHO pressed the early pace, gained command on the second turn then weakened. THIS IS HOUSTON was never far back, raced two wide on the far turn and finished evenly. THE REIGN FALLS failed to menace. CROWDED COURSE lacked speed, then passed tiring rivals late. LASTSTAGETOBOSTON was through after a half. ROUGH'N IT set the pace early with a clear lead, then gave way on the second turn. SKIP THE CROWD pressed the pace from the two path into the far turn then faltered.
